






FALL COLORS

BEST LOCATIONS TO VIEW FALL FOLIAGE





SCHOOL STREET

From W Henry St. to Mill St.

Downtown Ukiah and specifically School Street comes alive with fiery, glowing colors in the fall months. The leaves start turning around mid-September and are at peak color into November.

Tip: Stand at the cross-section of W. Standley and School St and look down the street to the South or North for the best colors and photo opps.

OLD RIVER ROAD

From Hopland to Ukiah


For one of the valley's most scenic fall drives, exit Highway 101 just before the Russian River Bridge in Hopland and follow Old River Road north. The route winds beneath golden oak canopies and past vineyard vistas where grape leaves glow in shades of yellow, rust, and burnt umber.

Tip: Pack a thermos of coffee and take an early morning drive for misty vineyard views.

CITY OF TEN THOUSAND BUDDHAS

Wander the serene grounds of the City of Ten Thousand Buddhas as the tree-lined avenues shift into golden yellows and deep reds. The quiet atmosphere makes the changing colors even more striking.

Tip: While there grab lunch at the <u>Jyun</u>
<u>Kang Vegetarian Restaurant</u> or visit the
<u>Book and Gift</u> store for Buddhist souvenirs.

MILL CREEK

Mill Creek Road, Talmage

A local favorite for fishing, hiking or a picnic on a fall day. Mill Creek offers the beauty of reflective water views surrounded by changing leaves. To take in the views of the Ukiah valley, try the Valley View Trailhead (West) hike.

Tip: Head out in the late afternoon light when the sun hits the water for glowing photo-worthy scenes.

<u>Disc Golf:</u> 18-hole course with lakefront views. <u>More info + map of disc golf</u> <u>course</u>


<u>Fishing</u>: Bass, trout, and catfish are active in cooler temps.




